Talk to your family about the statistic. | Draw a map of yard. Use steps as a form of measurement – how many steps from your house to the doghouse? The shed? The bushes? Etc. What's the perimeter of your yard? You can use a GPS or GPS app to help! | List all factors of 96 and 64. What are the common factors? GCF? | Can you build a rectangular prism? Use paper or cardboard and tape to build one. Calculate the surface area of the 3D shape you built. |

| <p>Download the iNaturalist app. Use it to help identify at least 3 different plants or trees on a nature walk.</p> | <p>Build a container (rain gauge) to measure rainfall in your yard this year.</p> | <p>Find the cree, Nakota or Saulteaux names for at least 3 different plants or trees in yard or nation. Teach a younger child about the plant using its Indigenous name.</p> | <p>Scavenger hunt! Go outside and find: one strong smell, two brightly coloured items in nature, three different nature sounds, four different tracks, and five pieces of trash (throw them away!).</p> <p>bonus: one repurposed object</p> |
